

MOBILE APP UPDATE: MY RECEIPTS



A new feature of the **With U • For U** mobile app, called **My Receipts**, was announced last month. My Receipts makes it quick and easy to collect, store, and share receipts (and other supporting documents) for reimbursement of business travel and events. Instead of holding on to paper receipts and remembering to give them to your arranger for reimbursement, use this optional tool to take photos of your receipts and store them in one place—an electronic filing cabinet in the cloud. Share your receipts by simply sending a notification email to your arranger.

DBIA is a national organization that defines, teaches, and promotes best practices in design-build project delivery. TEM was up against two larger projects in construction cost for the Excellence in Design, Engineering award: a Pepsi plant in Singapore and an Anheuser Busch facility.

Anteater Learning Pavilion was officially awarded LEED Platinum, bringing the total number of campus LEED Platinum certifications to 18. This is a result of a team effort among Design & Construction Services (DCS), the university, design builder Hathaway Dinwiddie, and designer LMN Architects. Toys and teddy bears will be collected through Monday, December 11, at the following locations:


- UCI Police Department

SERVICE SPOTLIGHT: NATIONAL BIOSAFETY STEWARDSHIP



October is National Biosafety Stewardship month that is promoted by the National Institutes of Health (NIH) and other Department of Health and Human Services agencies to reinforce attention to biosafety policies, practices, and procedures.

Last month, Environmental Health & Safety (EH&S) hosted its first National Biosafety Stewardship event and organized the following activities: free biohazardous waste pickup, five free biosafety cabinet (BSC) certifications for the perfect BSC setup, and IBC chitchats.

Over 150 faculty, staff, and students participated in the chitchat event. Professor and Director Cellular & Molecular Immunology Laboratory Lbachir BenMohamed, Ph.D., stated, “The way a bench, a hood, and a lab is cleaned and organized often reflect how your data are cleaned and organized. I also instigate a rule in my lab: *At the end of the day, once all experiments are finished, clean up after yourselves so that the next person who starts the next experiment will find that bench or that hood clean.* It makes next person happy to start the experiment.”
